#### **Background:**

Language is a skill, like any other skill until and unless we practice the skill mastery is highly impossible. The aim of learning a language is directly linked with the LSRW skills that are to be developed. As a universal process communication influence the activities of the human community at large. Social development is a prominent feature of effective techniques of communication, which is necessary for sustaining the growth and development. English language is an international medium of communication. People use English as a second language to interact and communicate on a daily basis. The English language is a key factor in gaining access to many things. Be it in your career or in terms of knowledge, English language is universally acceptable. In fact, it majorly dominates other languages because of its power of communication. The English language is not as difficult as it is perceived to be. Anyone can learn the language starting with basics. You can gain a lot of information if you know the language well.

#### **Objectives of the Workshop:**

- i. To create awareness about importance of Communication Skills in the global world.
  - ii. To make students know different ways of development of Communication skills.
  - iii. To train students to use grammatically correct English by imparting knowledge of basic grammar.
  - iv. To develop spoken English of the students.
  - v. To teach students to correct their pronunciation by consulting pronunciation dictionary.
  - vi. To teach students to compose e-mail, write job applications, CV/Resume Writing etc.
- v. To give equip students to become independent English language learner.

#### **Methodology:**

The methodology is essentially practical and with an individual supervision of each student. It is based on the teacher's previous explanations in class of the different topics dealt with each day and then each student works individually with the exercises progressively proposed and supervised by the teacher, including:





1. Dialogues (five dialogues per unit in which the student interacts with the software, pronouncing among different options).
2. Image / Word association (pronunciation of words according to the image).
3. Pronunciation of sentences and words (according to each topic and dialogue).
4. Phonetics exercise with spectrograms (pronunciation of sounds which appeared in dialogues).
5. Ordering sentences (pronouncing sentences in an orderly way).
6. Dictation (listening and writing what has been pronounced).
7. Games (Word search and crosswords with sounds).
8. Film dubbing (dubbing two film scenes; the students dub the characters' voices and then listen to themselves).

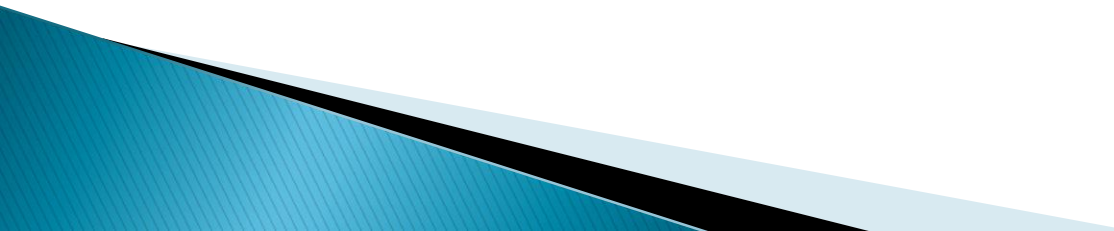

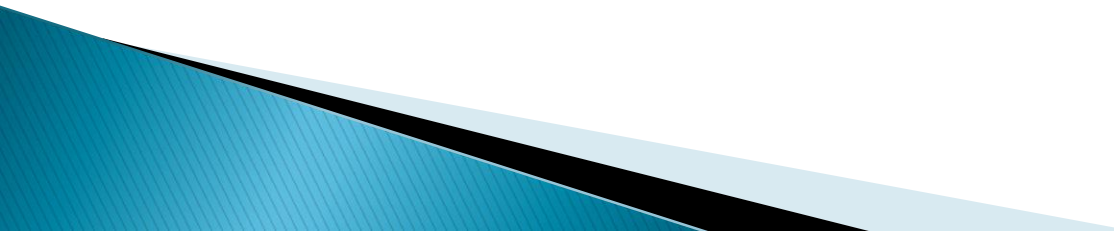

- What is educational technology?
  - Educational technology is the development, application and evaluation of systems, techniques and aids to improve the process of human learning. (cited by Lucido, 1997)
  - It is the theory and practice of design, development, utilization, management and evaluation of processes and resources for learning. (Association of Educational Communication and Technology)

# Meaning of Educational Technology

- What is Technology?
  - Technology comes from the greek word techne which means craft or art.
  - Technology, therefore, refers to the art or craft of responding to our educational needs.
  - Technology is not just machines. It is a "planned, systematic method of working to achieve planned outcomes - a process not a product.



## Meaning of Educational Technology cont.....

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- Educational is a "complex, integrated process involving people, procedures, ideas, devices, and organization for analyzing problems and devising, implementing, evaluating, and managing solutions to those problems, involved in all aspects of human learning." *(Association for*

# Nature of Instructional Technology

# Disadvantage

- Little opportunity to assess how well students are learning the content.
- Not much time for questioning, clarification, or discussion.
- Students may become reluctant to ask questions in class, or may not ask enough questions to clarify any misunderstandings as they do not feel comfortable letting faculty know that they do not understand key concepts.
- There is no opportunity for application of higher-level cognitive skills because it is not required.
- Students may become tedious and bored.

- Faculty need to be experts in the content area.
- Active learning experiences may be difficult to organise.
- May become stressful for faculty as it requires more time and energy.
- Faculty may receive less favourable evaluations from students.
- The necessity to adapt to new ways of learning may become stressful for the students.
